# **Centre Action Plan**

In our last Newsletter (February) I reported that a delegation would be attending the Second IEE Centres Congress in Birmingham at the end of March. The outcome of two days intensive debate, discussion and social activities was a new Action Plan for the Centre that will be used to focus our activities over the next three years. Whilst many of our committee objectives remain unchanged by the Congress, we have agreed the points outlined below (not in any priority order) for specific action.

## Consider establishing a Retired Members Section

In placing additional emphasis on CPD related activities in our programme, we are aware that this may isolate a large percentage of our local membership who have no real wish to 'professionally develop' themselves further. We will therefore be seeking the views of our retired members during the forthcoming session to assess support for specially targeted events during the 1999/2000 session, perhaps organised at more appropriate times.

## Gain Sub-Centre Status for North Lincs District

The Sheffield Centre Committee has already agreed to support the transfer of NLD to Sub-Centre status which, if successful, will result in improved representation for its membership.

## Establish a higher profile for the IEE within the local area

The IEE is aware that its public relations could be improved and has agreed to back Centre committee roles of Public Relations Officer and Marketing Officer with appropriate training relating to dealing with the media and 'marketing' the IEE on a local basis.

### Establish a Sheffield Centre Web Site

This is just one way in which we can improve communications with the membership. In a recent newsletter, we requested assistance with developing a web site and am pleased to report that we had an excellent response – thanks to all who replied. ### Hold regular membership transfer events

We have a high proportion of non-corporate members in the Centre and hope that by staging appropriate events we can help them to make the transfer to corporate membership. Action has already been taken on this – see our programme.

### Improve links with local SME's

Small to Medium Enterprises make up a large proportion of local businesses, especially in high tech industries. We wish to improve our links with these companies and to stage events that they will find beneficial. To this end, we are holding a series of events on meeting the requirements of the Electromagnetic Compatibility (EMC) Directive early in the session.

### Improve Centre links with student members

The student population in Sheffield is served by a number of IEE appointed Student Counsellors working within relevant departments. We wish to work more closely with the SC's to increase contact with this relatively large body of young members so that they are aware of how continued IEE membership will benefit them throughout their careers.

### Involve families in our events

It is apparent that there are many time pressures on engineers with young families and that this prevents them from taking part in our activities. We intend therefore to introduce more family oriented events over the next few years. This should improve social contact between members and may inspire another generation to take an interest in engineering.

### **Re-assess members needs**

It is some time since we last surveyed our Centre membership and we feel that we should now repeat the exercise to get your views on how the IEE is working for you locally. The answers you provided in the last survey were valuable, so please fill in the questionnaires when you receive them.
