# **Petition for North Lincs District - Sub Centre Status**

To be able to progress an application the IEE rules for creation of Areas and Sub Centres require the following of the petition:

- 1. The majority of those responding are in favour of the change and
- 2. Not less than 20 Corporate members of whom not less than 4 shall be Fellows are in favour of the change.

As you can see from the results we clearly meet these rules and the North Lincs committee had agreed to progress the application. The next stage of the procedure requires the submission of a report that details the reasons for the application. This report is currently being prepared and it is hoped it will be ready for the January meeting of the IEE Centres Board.

We will keep you informed of developments.

# 3<sup>rd</sup> UNIVERSITY FOR SHEFFIELD

#### The University for Industry to be based in Sheffield

The Education and Employment Minister, Baroness Blackstone has announced that the proposed **University for Industry** is to have its headquarters in Sheffield. The UFI will be launched in the year 2000, with £40 million made available for development during the year 1999/2000.

The UFI is a government initiative, which aims to transform the way people learn. Unlike the conventional educational institutions, which are campus based, the UFI will use new technology and a network of learning centres to promote lifelong learning,

ranging from the basic skills of literacy and numeracy to specialised technological skills and business management.

The UFI will also act as a broker, commissioning materials and providing information to a wide range of people interested in furthering their education or training. It is hoped that the UFI will play a key role in improving UK competitiveness by raising skills levels and employability.

The recommendation that Sheffield be chosen to host this key government initiative was made by Lord Sainsbury of Turvill, Chairman of the UFI's transition board. Commenting on the recommendation after evaluating a number of potential sites, Lord Sainsbury said. "I'm confident that we reached the right conclusion.

Sheffield is located in the middle of the country with excellent transport links to all parts. The local labour market has the skills the University will need, and we have a choice of good quality buildings".

The new Chief-Executive of the **University for Industry** will be Dr Anne Wright, currently Vice-Chancellor of the University of Sunderland.

# What is EMC?

EMC stands for ElectroMagnatic Compatibility, which in English means, the ability of equipment to function correctly in its electromagnetic environment, so that it's operation will not be affected by external electromagnetic sources and neither will it interfere with other electronic or electrical equipment so that they malfunction. To illustrate this various examples of incompatibility have been reported.

Cases reported by the US government include an electronic wheelchair spontaneously moving towards street traffic after its control circuits were interfered with by a local transmitter, a laser beam redirecting itself into the audience of a light show, a defibrillator failing to resuscitate a patient and a patient monitoring system failing to detect a patients critical condition, (allegedly the patient had been dead for 2 hours with the system showing a current heart rate of 60 beats per minute)

Closer to home the US medical fears are mirrored in most hospitals having a policy of telling visitors to switch off mobile phones whilst on hospital premises, because of the risk of interference to hospital equipment. Many cases are reported of remote central locking systems on cars malfunctioning as they are being jammed by more powerful local transmitters, (Imagine the scene, a frustrated rep locked out of his rep-mobile, unable to get to his car phone to ring for assistance, flags down another rep, who parks next to him gets out of his identical rep-mobile locks the door and goes to offer assistance, only to find that he too can't get to his car phone, so he flags down an identical rep-mobile......)

# John Leeson Retires after 45 Years Service to Centre

John Leeson retired from his role as Schools Liaison at the end of the last session after 45 years of service to the Centre. John joined the IEE as a student in November 1944, some six months after joining the Royal Air Force.

He transferred to Associate Membership in 1950 and commenced his long association with the Centre when he agreed to serve as a member of the North Midland Student Section in March 1951, becoming its Chairman in 1954. He gained full membership in 1960 and served as Assistant Honorary Secretary to the Sheffield sub-Centre until 1963.

In February 1965 he became a committee member of the North Midland Power Section, serving as its Chairman for the 1970/71 session. John returned in 1997 to serve on the committee of the newly formed Sheffield Centre.

In January 1979 he took on the role of Assistant Schools Liaison Officer to Charles Cooksley, taking on the full responsibilities in May of that year. John transferred to the status of Fellow in October 1980 and received his IEE 50-Year Award in October 1993.

Between September 1976 and 1997 John served as a member of the 'Yorkshire and Humberside CEI', the 'Yorkshire Region of the Engineering Council' and the 'Yorkshire and Humberside PEI'.

It is evident that John has had a varied and productive involvement with the IEE, however his 20 years service as Schools Liaison Officer (making him the longest serving SLO within the IEE) must be his finest achievement. The Centre Committee wishes john well in his well-deserved "retirement", although his services might still be required from time to time!
